### ORGANIZATION **HISTORY**

#### **COMMUNITY ADVOCATES**

In September 1976, Community Advocates opened in a small storefront on Milwaukee's north side to provide basic services for Milwaukee's poorest families and individuals. Three volunteers – Community Advocates' first Executive Director & Board President, Ramon Wagner (a former priest in the Catholic Church); Secretary/Treasurer and Associate Director, Sharon Kusmirek; and Vice-President, Myron Wagner – started the agency with the ambition to provide basic life-sustaining services for Milwaukee's neediest individuals and their families until they could move forward on their own.

In its early years, Community Advocates developed a community-wide role in advocating for the interests of its client groups, ensuring that governmental agency decision-making was fair, based on clearly defined criteria, and always respectful of the clients' needing services. The agency also became a key driver of a coalition-building approach to marshaling resources to address the community's social service needs. Program development involved income supports, housing, medical access, utility disruption, and disability advocacy. These frontline operations continue today as key pillars of the agency's programming.

Community Advocates was founded as a general advocacy agency with the vision of providing fundamental assistance and information to Milwaukee's low-income and disadvantaged populations living in a community in which each person envisions a future with hope. Our mission is to provide individuals and families with advocacy and services to meet their basic needs so they may live in dignity. Addressing peoples' needs at the most basic levels is why the agency was created and it continues to be its main focus to this day.

Community Advocates provides skilled and results-focused advocacy services to individuals and families experiencing extremely difficult basic needs, heat/utilities, and housing challenges. The strategies used include one-on-one advocacy, trauma-informed case management, representation, information/referral, crisis intervention, education, systems advocacy, and coalition building. Programs are focused on serving Milwaukee's low-income population but are available to any person or family in need regardless of their income level. Currently, Community Advocates operates over 40 programs offered through four divisions providing a continuum of direct programs and services to men, women, and children in Milwaukee County designed to ensure that all families or individuals are able to meet their needs. The successes on the following page highlight the agency's accomplishments in 2022.

### ORGANIZATION **HISTORY**

#### **COMMUNITY ADVOCATES**

1976 - 2005

During Ramon Wagner's tenure as Community
Advocates' Executive Director from 1976 – 2005, he
brought a vision and passion to his work and left behind
an organization with tremendous heart, and it is in his
spirit of service that the agency continues to move
forward. Leaving behind a staff of 30 and a budget of
\$5M in at the time of his death in 2005, Ramon and
Community Advocates had developed a communitywide role in advocating for the interests of its client
groups, ensuring that governmental agency decisionmaking was fair, based on clearly defined criteria, and
always respectful of the clients needing services.

2005 - 2014

Ramon embodied the vision and spirit of Community Advocates and was a mentor and father figure to the agency's future leaders. Joseph Volk succeeded Mr. Wagner as Executive Director in 2005, a position he held until early 2014 and in September 2014, the Community Advocates Board named Andi Elliott, who had worked for Community Advocates for more than 20 years, to serve as the CEO, a position she continues to hold.

LATTER 2000'S The latter half of the 2000's was a period of growth and expansion for Community Advocates as the agency created the Public Policy Institute (2008) and merged with the Milwaukee Women's Center (2007) and the Bottomless Closet (2011). Community Advocates also served as the receivership for the transfer of homeless programs from the American Red Cross (2009) and Social Development Commission (2010). These mergers presented Community Advocates with an opportunity to enhance the scope of services to men, women, and children in Milwaukee County in the areas of domestic abuse, addiction treatment, behavioral health, and homelessness. Soon thereafter, the agency developed and implemented an organizational restructuring plan resulting in expanded program service contracts and financial stability.

### 2022 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

#### **BASIC NEEDS**

- 2,000 individuals lived in households, which received homeless prevention and housing assistance so that they could live in safe and affordable housing.
- 9,904 emergency rent assistance applications were processed, and 6,394 landlords were engaged with information on emergency rental assistance and eviction diversion. prevention tools through the U.S. Treasury Emergency Rental Assistance Program.
- 444 adults and 613 children received intensive case management services and support to increase housing stability, school stability, and financial stability.
- 29,607 Energy Assistance applications were processed to provide needed financial assistance and payment plans for these families to maintain their utilities.
- 7,088 individuals completed Crisis applications to prevent disconnection or have their utilities restored.
- 133 consumers received assistance with filing for SSI/SSDI benefits.
- 74 individuals with disabling conditions received protective payee and financial management services.

#### **BEHAVIORAL HEALTH**

- 46 individuals safely and stably housed at the Autumn West Safe Haven.
- 190 men and women living on the street were outreached by the Homeless Outreach Program.
- The Autumn West Permanent Housing Program provided immediate access to safe and affordable housing to 102 Milwaukee residents who have been identified as chronically homeless and living with a disability.

#### **MILWAUKEE WOMEN'S CENTER**

- 138 adults and 77 children received emergency transportation, safe housing, support, and comprehensive domestic violence services through the Milwaukee Women's Center Domestic Violence Emergency Shelter.
- 99 low-income women and men and 156 children experiencing homelessness received shelter and assistance through the Family Support Center Emergency Shelter for families.
- The Older Abused Women's Program provided support, advocacy, and personalized services to 28 women age 50 and older who were abused physically, emotionally, and/or financially by their spouses, partners, adult children or older grandchildren.
- 103 men learned how to become better dads and role models through their enrollment in the FIRE Program.
- Of the 211 men who began batterers' prevention and intervention education, 165 successfully completed the program.
- 31 women received intensive, outpatient treatment through the POWER Program to overcome substance use disorders.
- 27 men and women received outpatient substance use disorder treatment through the Family Intervention Program, which provides treatment and support to African American and Latino families
- The Bottomless Closet provided career appropriate free clothing to support 101 women and 45 men who were seeking employment opportunities.

### 2022 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

#### **PUBLIC POLICY INSTITUTE**

- 49 families at risk of formal Milwaukee County Child Protective Services involvement were connected with supportive case management services, peer support, and home visitation by the Stronger Families Milwaukee Program.
- Policy Team addressed healthy housing, Transitional Jobs, re-entry supports, equitable green jobs, behavioral health care for job-seekers, and the Child Tax Credit.
- Alliance for Wisconsin Youth SE Region distributed 1,200 medication lock bags and 2,800 drug deactivation kits.
- 950+ youth benefited from life skills training, mentoring, or family strengthening via Brighter Futures Initiative-MKE's partners.
- 940 people participated in healthy RISE Drug Free MKE-sponsored activities.
- 30,000+ prevention materials distributed by RISE Drug Free MKE.
- 112 surveys collected by City of Milwaukee Tobacco Free Alliance from LGBTQ+ individuals on their experiences with substances.
- Mental Health and Wellness Trainings provided to 482 people, with 2,013 Mental Health and Wellness Resource Guides distributed.
